

If weather conditions are unfavourable, because of rain, wind or fog, with an unstable forecast, but the course is fit to play, Management may defer the decision to the right to play to the players themselves and will advise of this via the notice board in the Club House.

Should the player decide NOT to play, the player has the right to a voucher for identical conditions to those contracted valid for a maximum of six months from date of issue. This voucher must always be stamped and signed by Management.

Should the player voluntarily decide to play, but be forced to abandon the course, the following rules will apply:

- If at least one hole has been played, the player has the right to a voucher for 9 holes only.
- If at least ten holes have been played, the player has no right to any claims.

Vouchers are valid for a maximum of six months from their date of issue and must always be stamped and signed by Management.

Should weather conditions be unfavourable, because of rain, wind or fog, with an unstable forecast and the course NOT fit to play, Management may delay start of play until the weather improves sufficiently for minimum risk of damage to the greens and no danger to players.

Players who because of this miss their tee times will be allocated another time later in the same day or the following day, availability permitting. Should it not be possible to reprogramme start times, players will be offered a voucher for identical conditions valid for one year from date of issue.
